HABIT 6: Synergize

The habit of creative cooperation.

What does it mean to synergize? Google defines synergy as “the interaction or cooperation of two or more groups to produce a combined effect greater than the sum of their separate effects.” When we synergize, we get a far better result than we could have on our own. It’s not your way or my way, but our way. Stephen Covey said that “Synergy is the true test and manifestation of all the other habits put together.”

When we synergize, we strive to:

- Have one common vision-one common goal
- Be different
- Have a sense of self
- Stay open to new ideas-stay authentic
- Embrace trust
- Accept the better way will likely not be 100% our way
- Offer respect to everyone and everything
- Be able to apologize and forgive
- Practice mindful listening (listen with empathy)
- Maintain an open desire to understand
- Control negative judgement
- Stay with win-win (synergizing is not win-lose or lose-lose)

A Barnett parent sums it up perfectly: “I think we live in a time where people feel like if we don’t all agree with each other then we are against each other. This habit helps teach that we don’t all have to be the same (how boring would that be!?) and that each person brings something different to the table and by recognizing as embracing differences even when we don’t agree, makes us so much better.” Teresa Pugmire
