## Principal's Corner

I hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving Break. I know mine was both enjoyable and relaxing. It is good to be back at school with all the great students and teachers at Barnett.

We are seeing some great progress in both reading and math with those students that are regularly practicing each night at home. If you haven't been as faithful having your kids read and practice their math facts each night – now would be a great time to start. It really makes a huge difference. One of our schoolwide WIGs (Wildly Important Goals) is to improve 1,100 Reading Levels by April 2020 and we are well on our way to achieving our goal. We have currently improved 200 levels since September! Ask your child what their lead measures are to move up reading levels. Some examples of lead measures might be reading for a certain time every night, coming to Guided Reading Groups prepared with their assignment, or trying to read different genres of books. If students can follow their lead measures each day they will see their lag measure of moving levels up definitely happen. Setting goals and achieving them is one of the many great things happening at our school with the Leader in Me program!

As winter is upon us, I wanted to discuss Barnett's policy for inside/outside days. We live in the great state of Utah where it often snows. Many students want to go outside and play in the snow and take a needed physical break from their studies. For the most part, students will be expected to go outside for recess. A few days during the winter are excessively cold and on these days students will be given a choice to stay in or go outside. On rare occasions (rain, blizzard, etc.) students will not be allowed to go outside. **Parents can help us out by sending their child to school dressed as if it will always be an outside day. This way they are proactive and prepared for whatever happens. If your child is getting over a sickness and you would prefer they not go outside, please send a note with your child and they will be required to stay inside.** More detailed information about our cold weather procedures can be found at the end of this newsletter.

**Tuesday, Dec. 17:** Light Up and Bright Up- Show your holiday cheer by wearing something with lights and sparkle.


**Wednesday, Dec. 18:** Wednesday Wonderland- Dress up like any Christmas Wonderland character

## **Barnett Elementary Cold and Inclement Weather Procedures**

With the more severe weather conditions of winter we wanted to review our procedures to both reassure and help parents and patrons prepare and plan.



- **We recommend that students arrive at school no earlier than 8:30am for supervision purposes.** The building will be open for students to wait for the start of class in a warm gym or commons area.
- Children should arrive at school dressed for the weather of the day so they can safely and comfortably enjoy recesses. In winter months, children should remember to bring shoes to change into from their snow boots. All healthy children will be expected to go out for recess except in extreme weather conditions (wind chill, rain, snow, etc.).
- If your child cannot participate in recess for health reasons, please send a note to this effect. If it is to be a prolonged indoor stay (longer than 3 days) please send a note from the doctor.
- Students will remain inside in extreme weather conditions such as: very cold temperatures (below 20 degrees) and wind chill, heavy rain and snowfall, unhealthy air/inversions (we check air quality daily).
- Please be considerate and safety conscious as you drop off and pick up students at school. The winter months see an increase in the number of cars. Remember to: not block the flow of traffic (inside lanes are for waiting/sitting; outside lanes for pull through), not block cross walk areas, use parking stalls not pull through lanes if you need to enter the building.
- In the event of a major weather event (severe storm, power outage...) the District's ParentLink system will be used to notify parents. This can be in the form of an automated phone call, text, or email. For this information to reach you it is important that you keep your contact information current within the online SIS system. Information will also be posted and updated on the district web page [www.nebo.edu](http://www.nebo.edu). All teachers and staff members will remain at school to care for the students. Unless otherwise notified, we will release students only to responsible adults or family members.

# Habits at Home

- Make a to-do list for your day and Think about you how you spend your money and talk about ways to save money.
